

Stanmore Chapel Sunday School Joseph – part 4

Genesis 45-50

At the end of last weeks session Joseph had comforted his brothers, saying that it was **God** who had sent Joseph to Egypt to save lives.

'When the news reached Pharaoh's palace that Joseph's brothers had come, Pharaoh and all his officials were pleased. Pharaoh said to Joseph, "Tell your brothers, 'Do this: Load your animals and return to the land of Canaan, and bring your father and your families back to me. I will give you the best of the land of Egypt and you can enjoy the fat of the land.'

(Genesis ch.45 v.16)

So they went back, got their father were 70 people in Israel's family.	and they all left for Egypt. There (Source: Genesis ch.45 v.25-28; ch.46 v.27)							
(Draw Israel and all of his family travelling to Egypt)

"I am God, the God of your (xxxfxaxxxtxxhxexxr)," he said. "Do not be (xxaxxfxrxaxxxixxdxxx) to go down to Egypt, for I will make you into a great nation there. I will go down to (xxxExxxgxxxxyxxxxpxxxxt) with you, and I will surely (xxxxbxxrxxxixxnxxgxxxx) you back again. And Joseph's own hand will close your eyes."

(Genesis ch.46 v.2-4)

So Israel's family came down to Egypt as God had said, and Pharaoh let them settle in the best part of the land. (Source: Genesis ch.47 v.5-6,11-12)

Some time later Israel (Jacob) became ill, and Joseph came to see him.

'Jacob said to Joseph, "God Almighty appeared to me at Luz in the land of Canaan, and there he blessed me and said to me, 'I am going to make you fruitful and increase your numbers. I will make you a community of peoples, and I will give this land as an everlasting possession to your descendants after you.' (Genesis ch.48 v.3-4)



Then Israel called his sons together, and blessed them and told them what would happen to them in the days to come. He gave instructions that they were to bury him with his father Isaac, and his grandfather Abraham, in the Promised Land, Canaan. Then he drew his feet up into his bed and was gathered to his people. (Source: Genesis ch.48 & ch.49)

So Joseph and his brothers, accompanied by all of Pharaoh's officials, did as Israel had commanded them, and buried him in Canaan, with his forefathers. Then they returned to Egypt. (Source: Genesis ch.50 v.4-14)

When Joseph's brothers saw that their father was dead, they said, "What if Joseph holds a grudge against us and pays us back for all the wrongs we did to him?"

(Genesis ch.50 v.15)

Cross out the wrong word to complete the verses:

His brothers then came and threw (water balloons/themselves) down before him. "We are your slaves," they said. But Joseph said to them, "Don't be (afraid/sore losers). Am I in the place of God? You intended to (drench/harm) me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many (video games/lives). (Genesis ch.50 v.18-20)

Joseph stayed in **(Egypt/The Hilton)**, along with all his father's family. He lived a hundred and ten years. (Genesis ch.50 v.22)

Then Joseph said to his brothers, "I am about to die. But God will surely come to your (aid/wedding) and take you up out of this land to the land he promised on oath to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob." And Joseph made the Israelites swear an oath and said, "(Gondor/God) will surely come to your aid, and then you must carry my bones up from this place." (Genesis ch.50 v.22)

Then having told his brothers what God would do, he died.


Chat with your parents/caregiver
