What did the Tax Collector ask God for?


(A promotion/Mercy)

(Luke 18 v.13)

(Draw both men as they were praying)

The Pharisee stood by himself (v.11-12)	The tax collector stood at a distance, not even looking up to heaven (v.13)

Who did Jesus say went home right with God? (Circle the right answer)



(Luke 18 v.14)

'For all those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted.'

(Luke 18 v.14b)

- ➤ How do you think the Pharisee felt about himself? (E.g. proud/modest/very good etc.)
- Did the Pharisee think he needed to ask God for anything?
- > What did the tax collector think about himself? (Hint: end of v.13)
- And what did the Tax Collector ask God for?

These are two completely opposite prayers aren't they? The Pharisee is pretending to thank God, but really he's just boasting and saying how good he is – 'not like OTHER people'. The tax collector however knows that he is a sinner and in need of God's forgiveness, and so humbly asks God for mercy.


Who's prayer did Jesus say was answered by God?


Jesus says that this is how everyone – how we – should be humble before God and not praising ourselves.

Let's pray!

Let's thank God - not that we are better than other people, because we aren't, but that God show's mercy to anyone that asks Him for it. Let's ask God to help us be more like the tax collector in the parable and to humble ourselves before God.

Let's say sorry to God for when we've sinned, and ask him for his mercy.
