
(Enslaved the Israelites with harsh labour/Increased his police force)

R..R..Rewind: Do you remember a few weeks ago, when we did some worksheets on Joseph? We saw God starting to act on his promises to Abraham and Isaac and Jacob – promises that Joseph reminds his brothers of right at the end of Genesis.

Let's remind ourselves of what God had promised Joseph's father Jacob back in Genesis chapter 46 v.2-4: God told Jacob not to fear going down to Egypt, because God would go with him, and would make Jacob (Israel) into a great nation there. Let's keep that in mind!

- ➤ What was it that the new Pharaoh was afraid of? (Hint: ch.1 v.9)
- What did Joseph mean to the new Pharaoh? (Hint: ch.1 v.8)
- What happened when Pharaoh oppressed the Israelites? (Hint: ch.1 v.12)
- ➤ Who was really in charge making Israel grow? (Remember Genesis ch.46 v.2-4)

Pharaoh didn't know Joseph, and so he certainly didn't know God's promises to Israel. Pharaoh didn't know that trying to oppress God's people would be pointless!! God was in complete control and very busy fulfilling his promises to Israel (Jacob). There was nothing Pharaoh could do to stop him!

Now (xxJxoxxsxxexpxhxx) and all his brothers and all that generation died, but the Israelites were exceedingly fruitful; they multiplied greatly, increased in (xxnxuxmxbxexxxxxxxxxxxx) and became so numerous that the (xxlxxxaxxxnxxdxxx) was filled with them.

Then a new king, to whom Joseph meant nothing, came to power in (xExgxxyxxxpxtxx). 'Look,' he said to his people, 'the Israelites have become far too numerous for us. Come, we must deal shrewdly with them or they will become even more numerous and, if war breaks out, will (xjxxoxixnx) our enemies, fight against us and leave the country.'

So they put slave masters over them to (xoxxpxpxrxesxsx) them with forced labour, and they built Pithom and Rameses as store cities for Pharaoh. But the more they were oppressed, the more they multiplied and (xsxxxpxrxxexxxaxxdxx); so the Egyptians came to dread the Israelites and worked them ruthlessly. (ch.1 v.6-13)

The king of (Rock'n'roll/Egypt) said to the Hebrew midwives, whose names were Shiphrah and Puah, 'When you are helping the Hebrew women during childbirth on the delivery stool, if you see that the baby is a boy, (bathe/kill) him; but if it is a girl, let her (smell/live).' The midwives, however, feared (Pharaoh/God) and did not do what the king of Egypt had told them to do; they let the boys live.

So God was kind to the midwives and the people increased and became even more (numerous/overweight). And because the midwives feared God, he gave them (kittens/families) of their own.

Then Pharaoh gave this order to all his people: 'Every Hebrew boy that is born you must throw into the **(Pool/Nile)**, but let every girl live.'

The midwives however <u>did</u> know & fear God. God was in complete control and very busy fulfilling his promises to Israel. There was nothing Pharaoh could do to stop him, and even ended up *paying* for one of the Hebrew boys to be raised (remember ch2 v.9)!!
