(The seven daughters of Jethro/Some sheep) (ch.2 v.16-17) When the Israelites cried out go God, what was God's response? (He was concerned for them/Not that bothered) (ch.2 v.25) What did Moses see when he was tending Jethro's flocks? (The shepherd's coming back/The angel of the Lord in a burning bush) (ch.3 v.2) What did God tell Moses he was going to do for Israel? (Ask Pharaoh to be nicer to them/Rescue them out of Egypt) (ch.3 v.7-10)

What were two of the signs that God told Moses to show the Israelites? (Draw what happened to each)

Chat with your parents/caregiver

Recap: We saw last week how God was starting to fulfil His promises to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob – and was growing Israel into a large nation. This week we start to see another part of the promise about to be fulfilled.

> What did Moses do for Jethro's daughters? (Hint: ch.2 v.17&19)

At the end of chapter 2 in verse 24, when the cries of the Israelites go up to God, we're told a very important detail: "God heard their groaning and he remembered His covenant with Abraham, with Isaac and with Jacob"

- What did God tell Moses He was going to do with the Israelites? (Hint: ch.3 v.7-10,16-17)
- > Who did God tell Moses He was sending to Egypt to do this? (Hint: ch.3 v.10)
- Who did God say would be with Moses that would enable this rescue? (Hint: ch.3 v.12)

God was about to do remarkable wonderful signs among His people, and was going to rescue them from the hand of the Egyptians. God was going to continue to fulfil His covenant, His promises, to Abraham, and Isaac and Jacob. And God was going to rescue them through His servant Moses.

One day, after Moses had (xxgxxxrxxoxwxxnx) up, he went out to where his own people were and watched them at their hard labour. He saw an Egyptian beating a Hebrew, one of his own (xpxxxexxoxxpxxxlxex). Looking this way and that and seeing no one, he (xkxxixxlxxxlxexxdxx) the Egyptian and hid him in the sand.

When Pharaoh heard of this, he tried to kill Moses, but Moses fled from Pharaoh and went to live in (xMxxixxxdxxixaxxnxx), where he sat down by a well. Now a priest of Midian had seven daughters, and they came to draw (xwxxxaxxtxxxexxrx) and fill the troughs to water their father's flock. Some shepherds came along and drove them away, but Moses got up and came to their (xxrxxexsxxcxxuxxexx) and watered their flock. (ch.2 v.11-12,15-17)

During that long period, the king of Egypt died. The Israelites groaned in their **(slavery/sleep)** and cried out, and their cry for help because of their slavery went up to God. God heard their **(concert/groaning)** and he remembered his covenant with Abraham, with Isaac and with Jacob. So God looked on the **(Midianites/Israelites)** and was concerned about them.

Now Moses was tending the flock of Jethro his father-in-law, the priest of Midian, and he led the flock to the far side of the **(wilderness/moon)** and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. There the angel of the Lord appeared to him in flames of fire from within a **(bush/furnace)**. Moses saw that though the bush was on fire it did not burn up.

When the Lord saw that he had gone over to look, God called to him from within the bush, 'Moses! Moses!' And Moses said, '(Here I am/ I'm busy).'

'Do not come any closer,' God said. 'Take off your **(sunglasses/sandals)**, for the place where you are standing is holy ground.' Then he said, 'I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob.' At this, Moses hid his **(face/wallet)**, because he was afraid to look at God. (ch.2 v.23-ch.3 v.2; ch.3 v.3-6)

- > What does God say will make Pharaoh let the Israelites go in ch.3 v.19-20?
